Proposed revision changes age range to match <u>U.S.</u> <u>Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF) recommendation</u> update.


**Objective 11.2:** By 2025, increase the percentage of Florida women aged <del>50</del> 40 to 74 years old in every Florida community who undergo mammogram.



## Percentage of Advanced Stage Cancer at Diagnosis in Florida by Sex & Race, 1995-2021



### State Ranking by High-Risk Screening Rate


#### Screening for High Risk:

- It ranks 29th among all states, placing it in the average tier.

### 2020-2025 Florida Cancer Plan Workgroups

The Florida Cancer Plan Workgroups aim to advance Goal 2:

Ensure the collection of **comprehensive and high-quality cancer-related data** from all Florida cancer patients to inform cancer prevention and control programs.

The workgroups focus on four main objectives:

Cancer Biology Data Access and Utilization Collection of Cancer Screening Data Social Determinants of Health



# Workgroup Updates

- Screening Data Workgroup Objective 2.4 By 2025, pilot the addition of cancer screening data as items collected and archived by Florida's statewide cancer data and surveillance program.
  - **Updates:** Tobacco Free Florida Funding received for two years. Working with two NCI cancer centers for data submission.
  - **Data Access/Use Workgroup Objective 2.6** By 2025, increase access to and utilization of cancer-related data archived in the state cancer registry (FCDS) by diverse stakeholder groups across Florida.
    - **Updates:** Phase I of the Oncology Data Specialist (ODS) support program. The ODS Team continues to meet with interested researchers to support data request applications.



# Workgroup Updates

- SDOH Workgroup Objective 2.3 By 2025 Pilot the addition of social determinants of health and additional patient demographics such as occupation or country of origin as data collected and archived by Florida's statewide cancer data and surveillance program
  Updates: Adding NCI SEER social determinants indicators to data items available to
  - researchers. Expanding these indicators into FCDS data visualization tools and data requests.
  - **Cancer Biology Workgroup Objective 2.2** By 2025, pilot the addition of cancer biology data such as somatic gene mutations or National Cancer Institute/ North American Association of Central Cancer Registries defined site-specific data items as data collected and archived by Florida's statewide cancer data and surveillance program.

**Updates:** Submitted application to the Innovation Fund. Seeking alternative funding sources.



 Identification of funding sources to further progress across all workgroup objectives.
