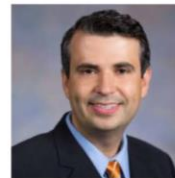

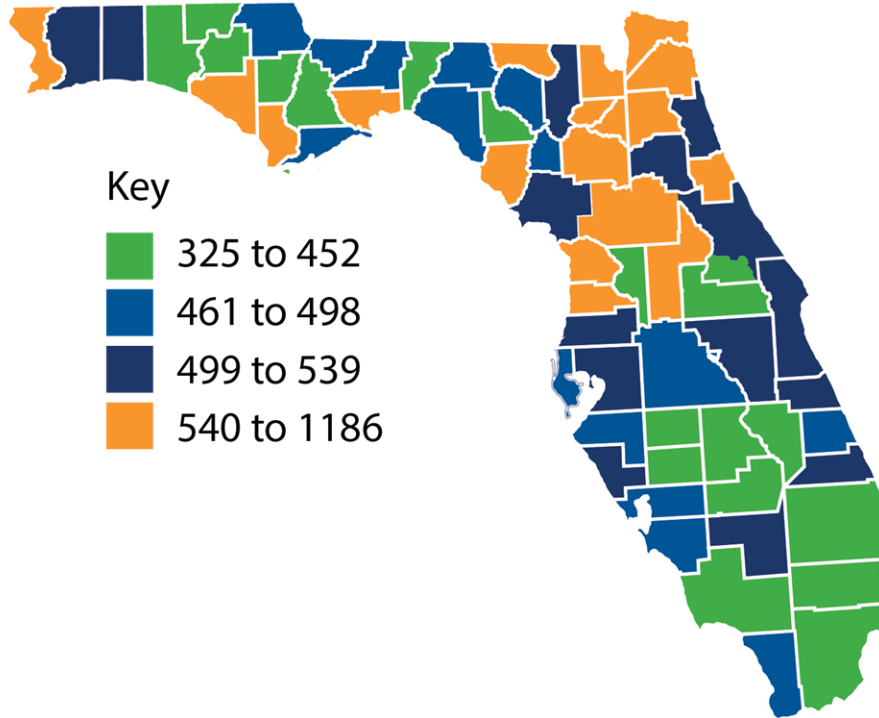

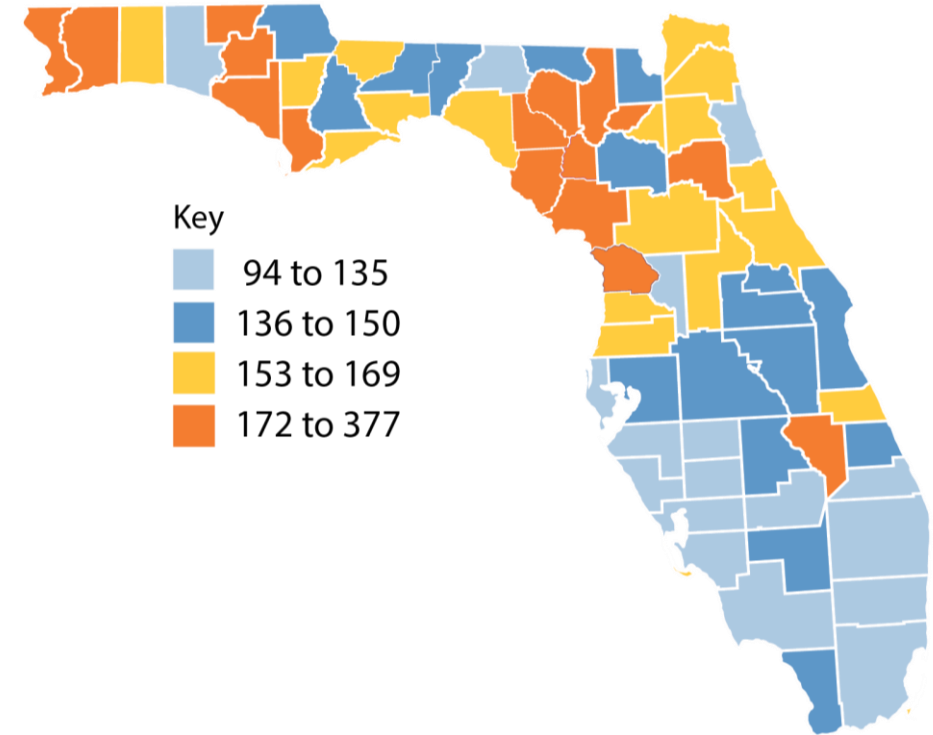


State/County Map for the Year 2021

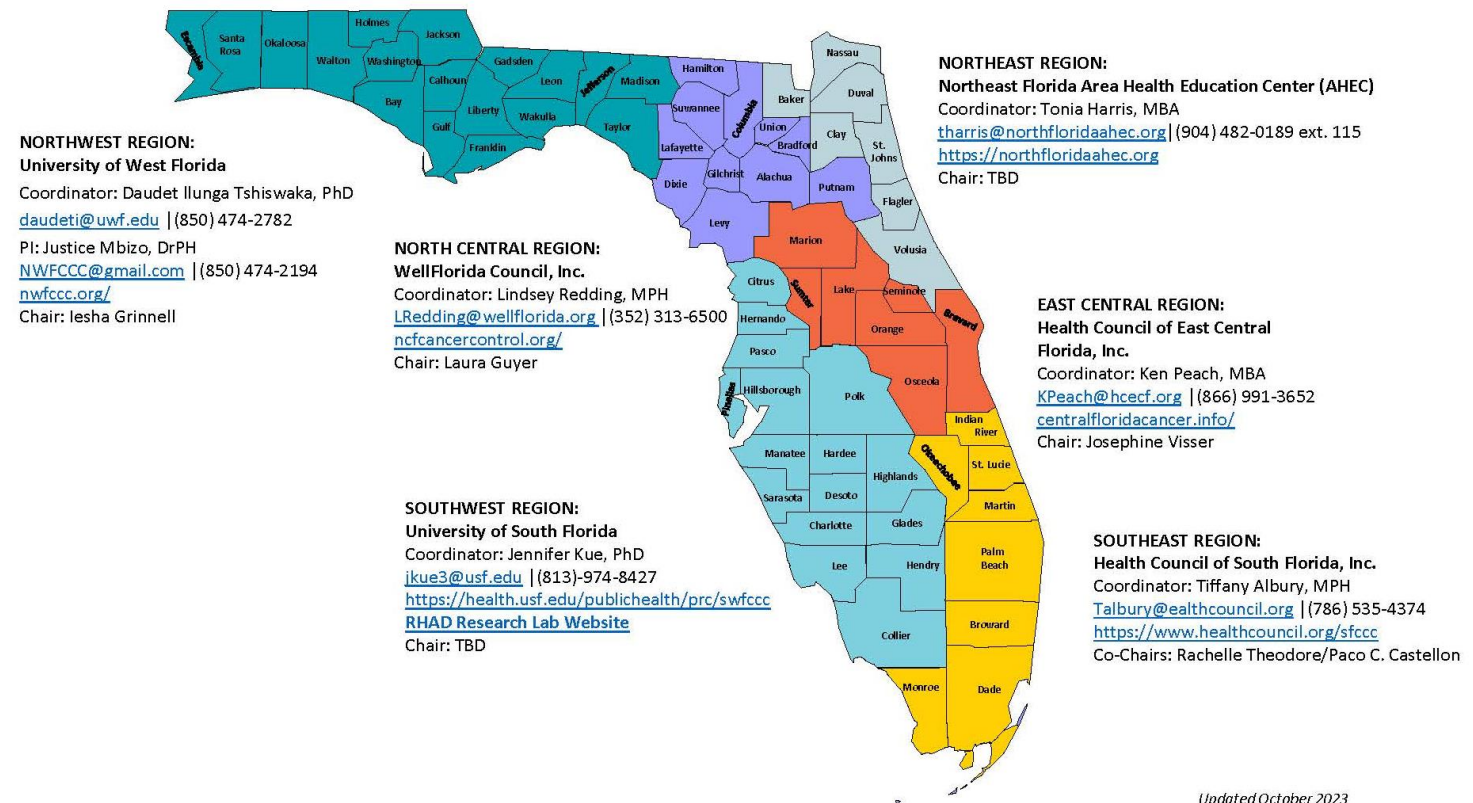

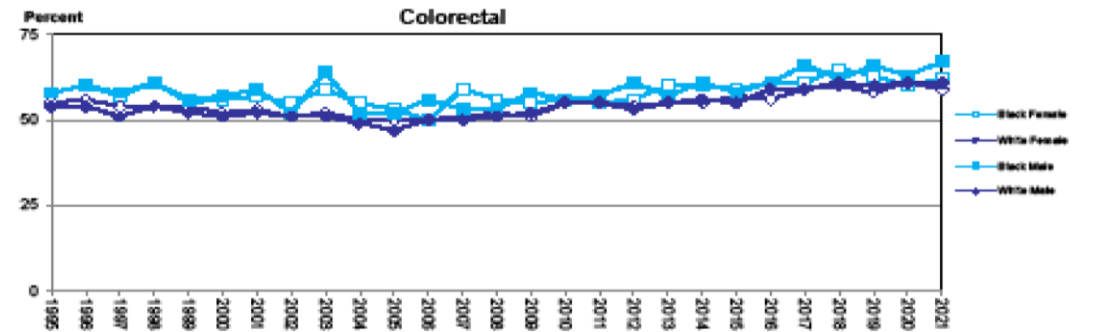
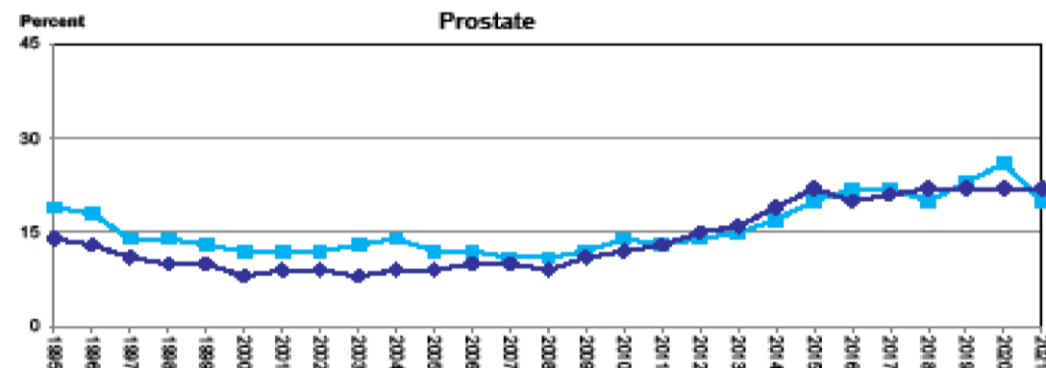
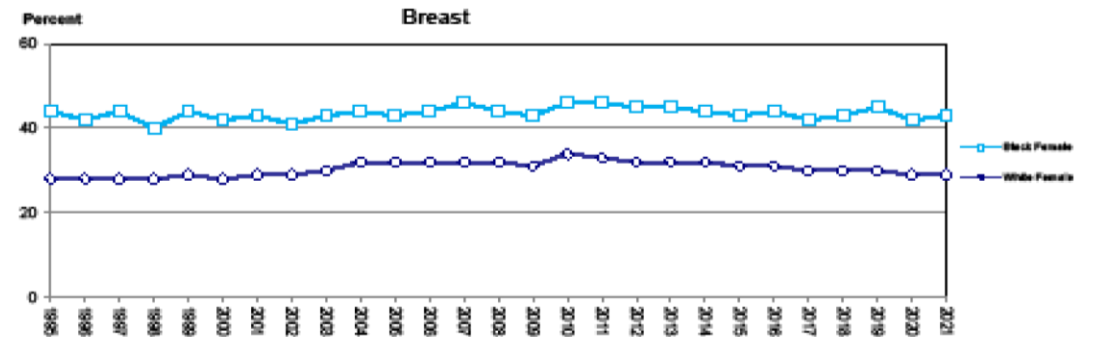
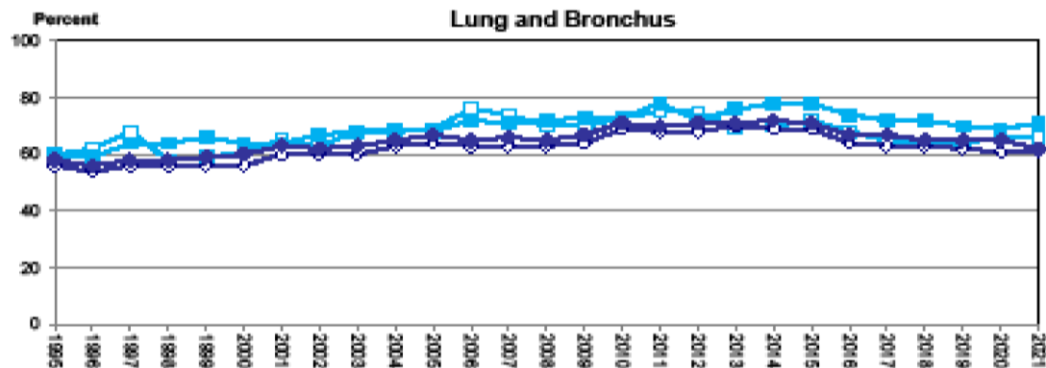

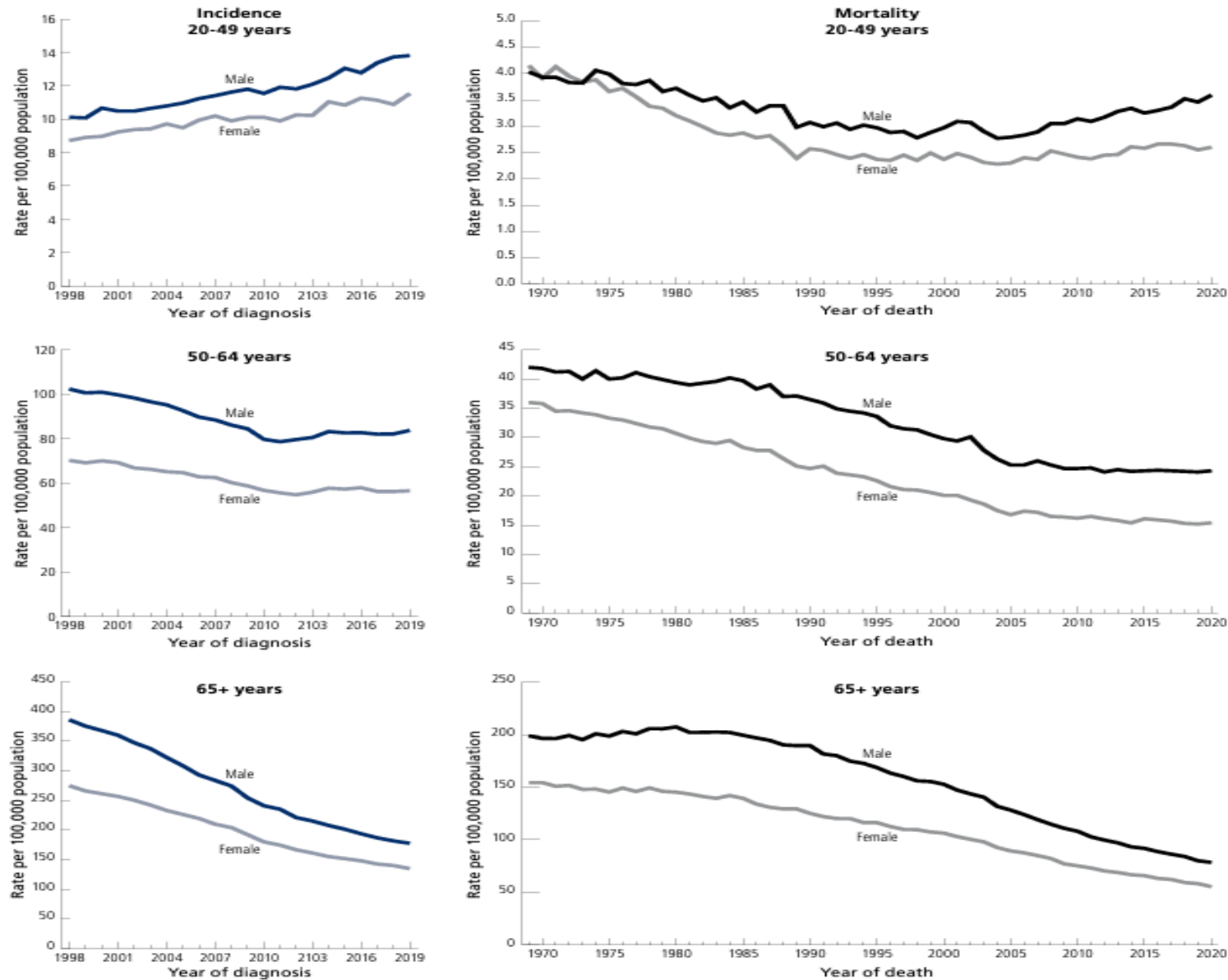


Colorectal Cancer Screening – Florida Cancer Plan

Goal 12: Reduce colorectal cancer mortality through early detection of colorectal cancer in Floridians.

- ❑ Objective 12.1: By 2025, among Floridians newly diagnosed with colorectal cancer, increase the percentage of those with limited stage disease (Stage 1 and 2) from 42.5% (Baseline, 2016 FCDS) to 50% or higher.
- ❑ Objective 12.2: By 2025, increase the percentage of Floridians aged 45 to 75 years old who have fully met the US Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF) recommendation for colorectal cancer screening from 70.4% (Baseline, 2018 BRFSS) to 80% or higher.*
- ❑ Objective 12.3: By 2025, draft legislation that builds upon the Florida Colorectal Cancer Control Program that supports both systems change to increase clinic screening rates and colorectal screening costs of uninsured and underinsured Floridians similar to the Mary Brogan Florida Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program.

Figure 7. Trends in Colorectal Cancer Incidence (1998-2019) and Mortality (1970-2020) by Age and Sex, US

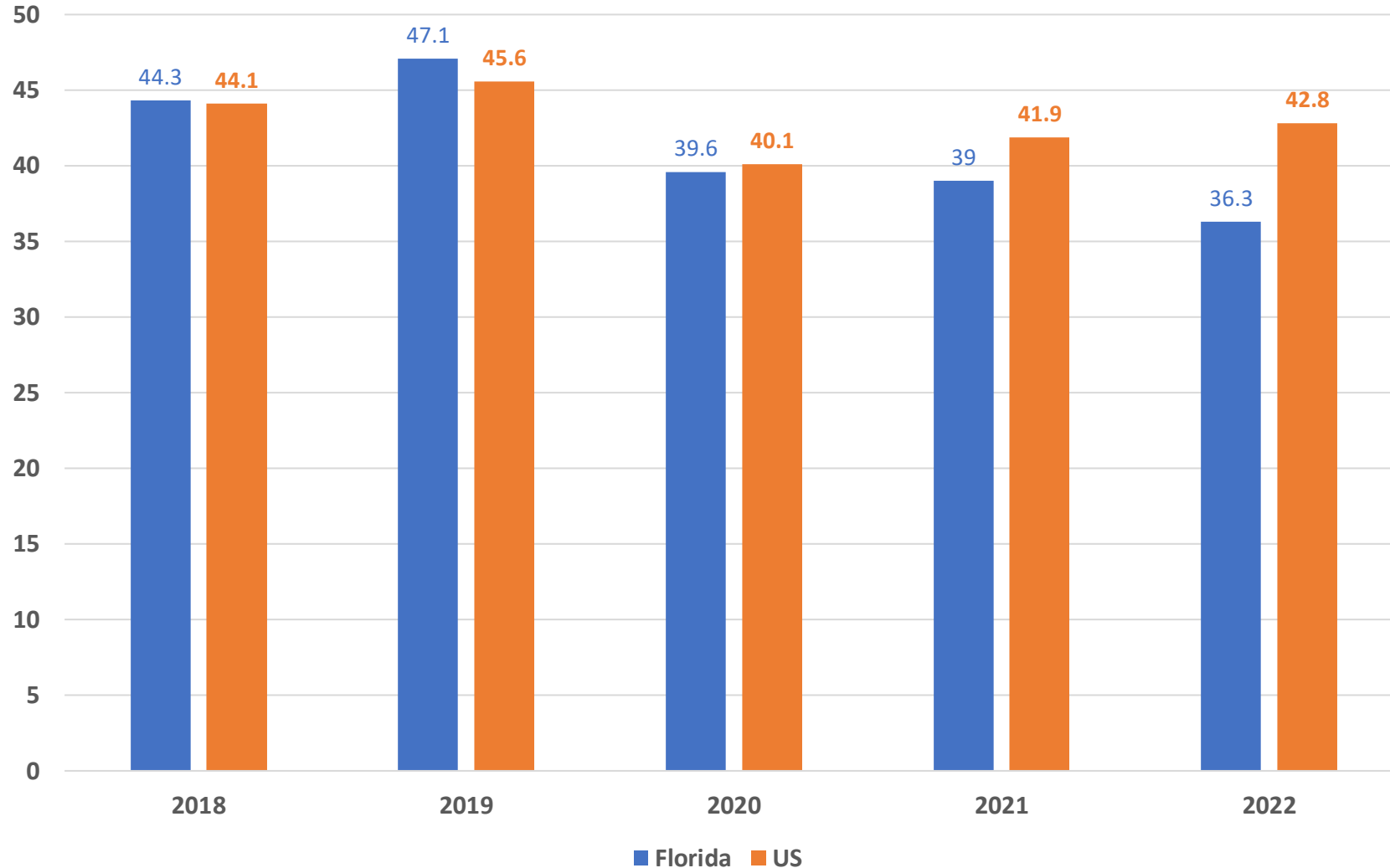


Rates are age adjusted to the 2000 US standard population. Incidence rates are adjusted for reporting delays and exclude appendix.

- ❑ Colorectal cancer incidence and mortality are increasing in people under age 50 years, nationwide.
- ❑ There is persistent male-female gender disparity over several decades.

Colorectal Cancer Screening in FQHCs

Colorectal Cancer Screening (UDS rates) in Federally Qualified Health Centers, Florida vs USA: % Ages 50-75 years up-to-date with CRC screening



- 80% goal (in every community)
- Healthy People 2030 goal: 74.4%
- Florida general population average 2022: 72.1%
- USA general population average 2022: 72.2%



Long-Term Vision of Cancer in Florida

- No disparities in cancer incidence and mortality
- Deep scientific understanding of cancer biology
- Strong workforce of cancer clinicians, researchers, policy workers
